Univ.-Prof. Dr. Daniela Schmid is the Head of the Division for Quantitative Methods in Public Health and Health Services Research at the Institute of Public Health, Medical Decision Making and Health Technology Assessment at UMIT – University for Health Sciences, Medical Informatics and Technology in Hall i. T., Austria. She is the Coordinator of the Master Program in Public Health (MPH) at UMIT.

Prior to her appointment at UMIT, she served as a Research Associate and Senior Lecturer at the Universities of Regensburg, Freiburg, and Ulm, Germany. Schmid earned a M.Sc. in Epidemiology from Ludwig-Maximilians-University Munich, a Ph.D. in Nutrition from Technical University of Munich, and a habilitation in Epidemiology and Preventive Medicine from University of Regensburg. She has held visiting appointments at the T.H. Chan Harvard School of Public Health, Boston, and the School of Food and Nutritional Sciences, Cork.

Her research interest is in the development and application of quantitative methods in public health and health services research, including statistical modelling for epidemiological and clinical questions, and the development of targeted risk reduction programs for chronic disease prevention. Dr. Schmid has (co-)authored numerous articles in internationally renowned journals and received multiple fellowships and awards for her research in public health.
