OUTLINE

Discover your unique academic path with our **Summer School**, designed for doctoral students. The program combines essential **research methods, academic publishing, open science, and emerging developments such as artificial intelligence in academia.**

Participants will engage with key methodological approaches, including **good scientific practice, regression analysis, and meta-analysis**, alongside contemporary topics such as **social media and misinformation and innovative funding approaches like microfunding.**

The summer school also addresses central aspects of **academic publishing and research integrity**, covering topics such as **paper mills, open science practices, and the peer review process.** A special focus is placed on the growing role of **artificial intelligence in research and teaching.**

Participants will benefit from our **Research Paper Clinic**, where they can present and further develop their work. The clinic welcomes contributions from all disciplines and methodological backgrounds, offering a space to exchange ideas, receive feedback from experienced researchers, and strengthen academic and presentation skills.

Participation can be rewarded with a certificate (4 ECTS). To obtain ECTS, participants are required to present a paper, discuss a peer's paper, and ensure full attendance. Participation without certificate is also possible; registration is required in all cases.

Submissions may be either a research proposal (extended abstract of approx. 600 words) or a working paper (7–10 pages). References are not included in the word or page count.
